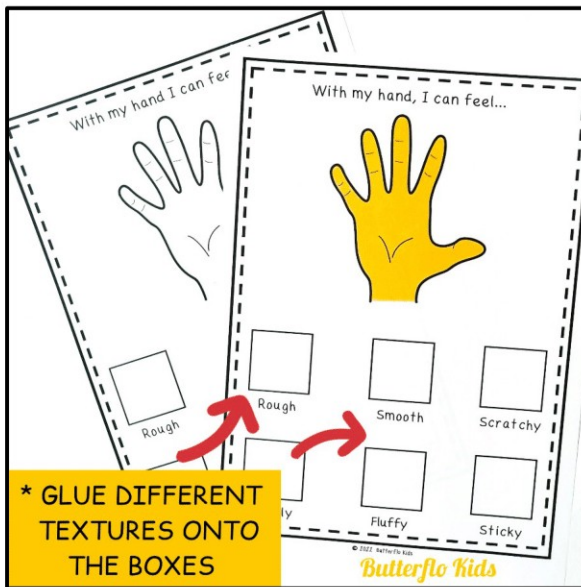

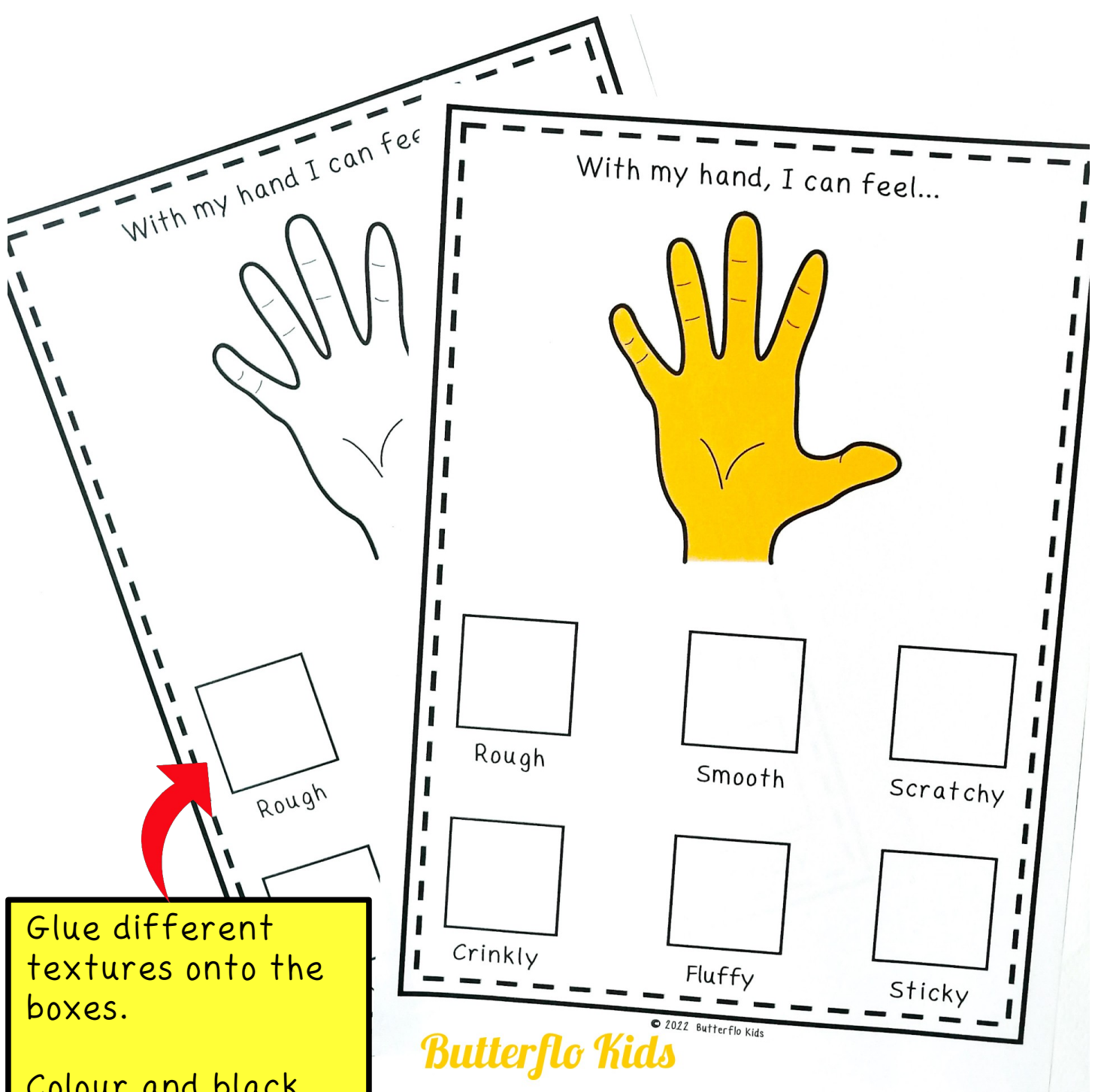


Ideal for display, or bulletin, boards.
